Some methods used by polyglots to learn new languages include speaking what you learn from the first day, by talking to people either personally or on-line; using the internet to chat with people who speak the language one is learning as a first language; imitating sounds of the language; learning the most frequent words of the language; studying grammar etc.
- 7. Lýdia says the one thing all polyglots have in common is finding ways to enjoy the language learning process.
- 8. You need effective methods, for example, revising words that you have been learning using space repetition; you also need to create a system in your learning, scheduling some time to learn a little every day so that you can follow a solid plan; and finally, you need patience, because learning a language takes some time.
- 9. You can find inspiration by looking for polyglots' YouTube channels and getting some ideas from them.
- 10. According to Lýdia, the most motivating aspect in the language learning process is one's own success.
- 11. Lýdia tells us the story of Benny and Lucas, two of the polyglots mentioned earlier. Benny studied Irish Gaelic for 11 years and German for 5 years at school, but he could not speak these languages when he graduated. After finding his own way to learn languages, today he can speak 10 different languages. Lucas studied English for 10 years at school, being one of the worst students in class. After finding his own way to learn, today he speaks 11 languages fluently.
